WHAT ARE THE OPTIONS?

Previously anyone who wanted to do teacher training did the five units of the RSCDS Teaching Certificate. Now there is a new option:

WHO IS IT FOR?

If you would like to develop your teaching skills, but don't want to commit to the Teaching Certificate right now, then CTI might be for you. It has been designed for those who primarily want to teach social and general classes, but it doesn't stop you from taking the Teaching Certificate later if you would like to.

The standard expected is one which would enable you to teach the social or general class you are teaching, or wish to teach, effectively. If you wish to teach a technique class or an advanced class then the RSCDS Teaching Certificate might be more appropriate.

WHO WOULD MENTOR ME AND HOW MUCH IS IT?

A list of mentors is available from the RSCDS, but locally (Ian and Emma Stewart) are RSCDS teachers who are also qualified as CTI trainers.

The RSCDS registration fee is £40 (*discounted fee £30 for younger dancers) and includes an e-book Manual of Scottish Country Dancing.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

CTI is primarily a mentoring process rather than a course and your class teaching will be reviewed with you by your mentor. When you and your mentor agree you are ready, a video will be made of you teaching a class and if you both feel happy with it, it will go to RSCDS HQ with your lesson plan, the mentor's report and recommendation.

All being well you will receive

your RSCDS Instructor's certificate a few weeks later.
